Session Updates

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has recently determined that the denomination, each synod, presbytery, and congregation develop an antiracism and antiharassment policy in addition to other required policies. The Presbytery of North Central California has asked that each congregation begin the process of developing these policies by forming a small group. If this is something in which you would be interested in participating. Please make this known to Jill in the church office.

The Christian Education Committee will begin looking into establishing a Sunday School program. If anyone has ideas or would like to be involved in this, please contact the chair of the Christian Education Committee, Lynda Mendoza.

Roy and Marie Patterson have agreed to continue coordinating the Feeding the Hungry program next year. If you would like to help with this ministry, please speak with either Marie or Roy.

The Finance Committee has sent out the stewardship letter for 2024, and request that the pledge cards be returned as soon as possible. Having an understanding of the expected income for next year greatly assists the committee in developing the budget.

Session approved the Worship and Music Committee to modify, on a trial basis, the way that the worship service is done. The Korean congregation has offered to lend our congregation their projector to enable the worship liturgy to be showed on the wall of the chancel. This trial period will run from December 10th through January 14th, after which the congregation's reaction to this change will determine how we go forward. A laptop computer has been acquired by Jean Shipman's generous agreement to use a portion of Ray Shipman's memorial funds. The Worship and Music Committee will use the computer to create a Power Point slide show for each worship service.

Session was made aware that Rev. Celeste Lasich is serving as the Transitional Pastor at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Sacramento. Rev. Lasich's first call after graduating from McCormick Theological Seminary was as the Associate Pastor in Tracy.
