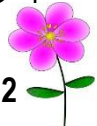

An offer to purchase both parcels of the new site was presented. The offer was contingent upon the sale of property in Manteca that is owned by the potential buyer. Session discussed the offer and authorized the *ad hoc* new site committee to respond with a counter offer. Unfortunately, the pending sale of the Manteca property may be delayed, and the purchase offer has been withdrawn.

Our Interim Pastor will take one of the Sundays away provided for in his contract, and Rev. Joshua Trautmann, formerly the pastor of the Geneva Presbyterian Church in Modesto and currently the Bridge Presbyter of the Presbytery, will be in the pulpit on June 16th.

The Finance Committee has identified several accounts that have been inactive for an extended period. It had been our practice to transfer the balance of certain special and in-and-out fund accounts to the general fund annually. In the recent past this has not been done, so the committee moved, and Session approved, the transfer of the balances of the following accounts to “other income” in the general fund:

- 1208 Pastor sabbatical sinking fund
- 1214 Presbytery grant fund
- 1258 Miscellaneous income

The balances of the following accounts were authorized to be transferred to account 1269, feeding the hungry:

- 1209 Lunch bunch
- 1265 Wednesday morning Bible study
- 1267 Mission / vegetables

In April we lost two long-time members of our church: Paul McCormick and Onalee Koster. Onalee had the longest tenure, having been a member since joining in 1944.
